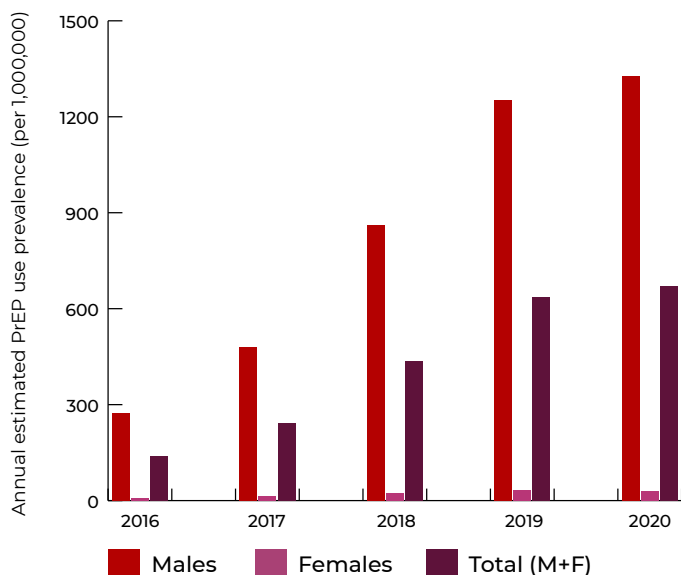




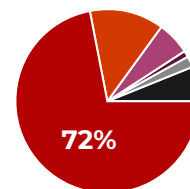
Trends in HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis use

The number of people on PrEP increased 4x from 2016 to 2020



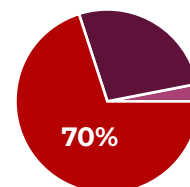
More than **70% of PrEP** prescriptions were prescribed by **primary care providers**



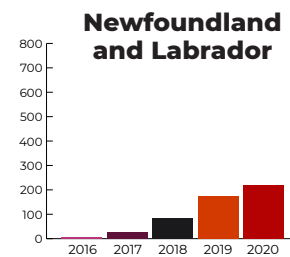
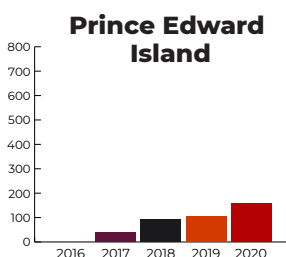
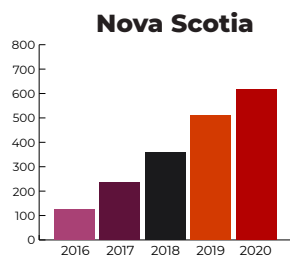
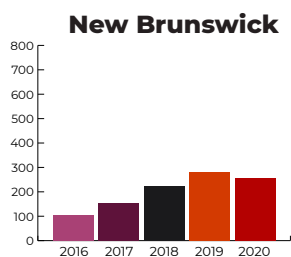
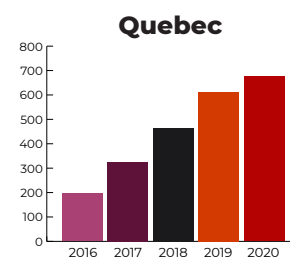
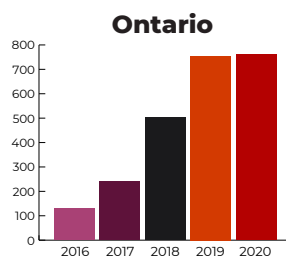
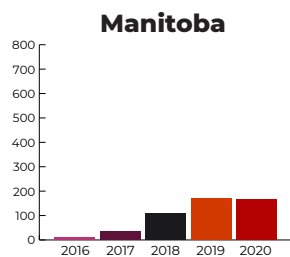
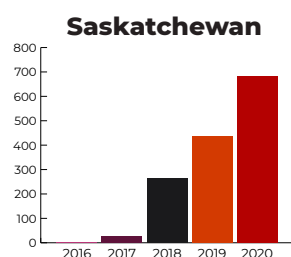
35% In 2020, 35% of people on PrEP were 25-35 years of age
